## Mayorca Limestone Trims Bring Light and Harmony to NYC's Corinthian

Stark was looking for a sleek, modern, durable material that was able to reflect the outdoor natural light into the space. Before the renovation, completed in March, there were dark gray acoustical panels on the main side walls that did not let natural light get in. The **Mayorca** trims, featured in an alternating pattern of honed and split face finishes, allow for a lot of natural light to penetrate all the way into the corridor areas. Complementing the trims, the balconies and back walls were surfaced with Armstrong wood panels to bring a warm feeling to the space.
